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# Foreword

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
*This report provides an overview of juvenile court dispositions in Pennsylvania during 2008 and preceding years, and summarizes juvenile court statistical data provided by county juvenile probation departments. Without the support of the courts and juvenile probation departments, this report would not be possible.*

*Although the report focuses primarily on delinquency dispositions, information has again been included on dependency cases that have been referred to juvenile probation departments. While county children and youth agencies handle the overwhelming majority of cases involving dependent children in the Commonwealth, some juvenile probation departments provide services to children who are alleged to be dependent on the basis of ungovernability or chronic truancy.*


*The information contained in this report is of value to all individuals, agencies and organizations having an interest in the Pennsylvania juvenile justice system. However, it is not intended to reflect the total workload of juvenile courts or juvenile probation departments.*

*It is with great pleasure that we dedicate this report to the judges, probation officers, victim advocates, district attorneys, service treatment providers, and other professionals who work on a daily basis in the Pennsylvania juvenile court system.*

# Preface

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This report is a compilation of the data collected from the juvenile probation departments in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

As in the past, to avoid confusion regarding the unit of count used in tabulating juvenile court statistics and to improve the understanding of how data can be interpreted please note:

1. The primary unit of count is the *disposition*. A *disposition* is defined as an allegation disposed of by the juvenile probation department and/or the court. Within a single delinquency allegation, a youth may be charged with a number of offenses that may result in multiple petitions. Any one youth may be involved in a number of dispositions within a calendar year. In addition, a youth may be referred on more than one occasion and receive only one disposition. Dependency dispositions include only those referrals to probation departments alleging dependency that are not accompanied by allegations of delinquency. Therefore, one is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret dispositions as: a) the number of youth who are processed by the court; b) the number of offenses charged to juveniles.
2. There are times when you will see the word case used to describe the data. In this report, the word case is used interchangeably with the word *disposition*;
3. The *unit of count* refers to a case disposed of by a juvenile court and/or juvenile probation department. The term *disposed* means that a definite action/decision has been implemented or that a treatment plan has been decided upon or begun;
4. The statistical system is constructed to collect up to the seven (7) most serious offenses per delinquency disposition;
5. The Commission collects additional information on *placement reviews*, *disposition reviews*, and selected special conditions attached to a disposition. A *disposition review* is a hearing conducted before the court regarding a previous disposition which did not result in out-of-home placement. A *placement review* is a hearing conducted before the court regarding a previous disposition which did involve out-of-home placement.
6. The data in the secure detention section of this report were collected in conjunction with the JCJC Standards Governing the Use of Secure Detention. This information should not be compared with detention data collected and reported prior to 1989.
7. The reader is cautioned that in the tables containing rows with percent of total, the row may not total 100 percent due to rounding.

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# Highlights of the 2008 Disposition Report

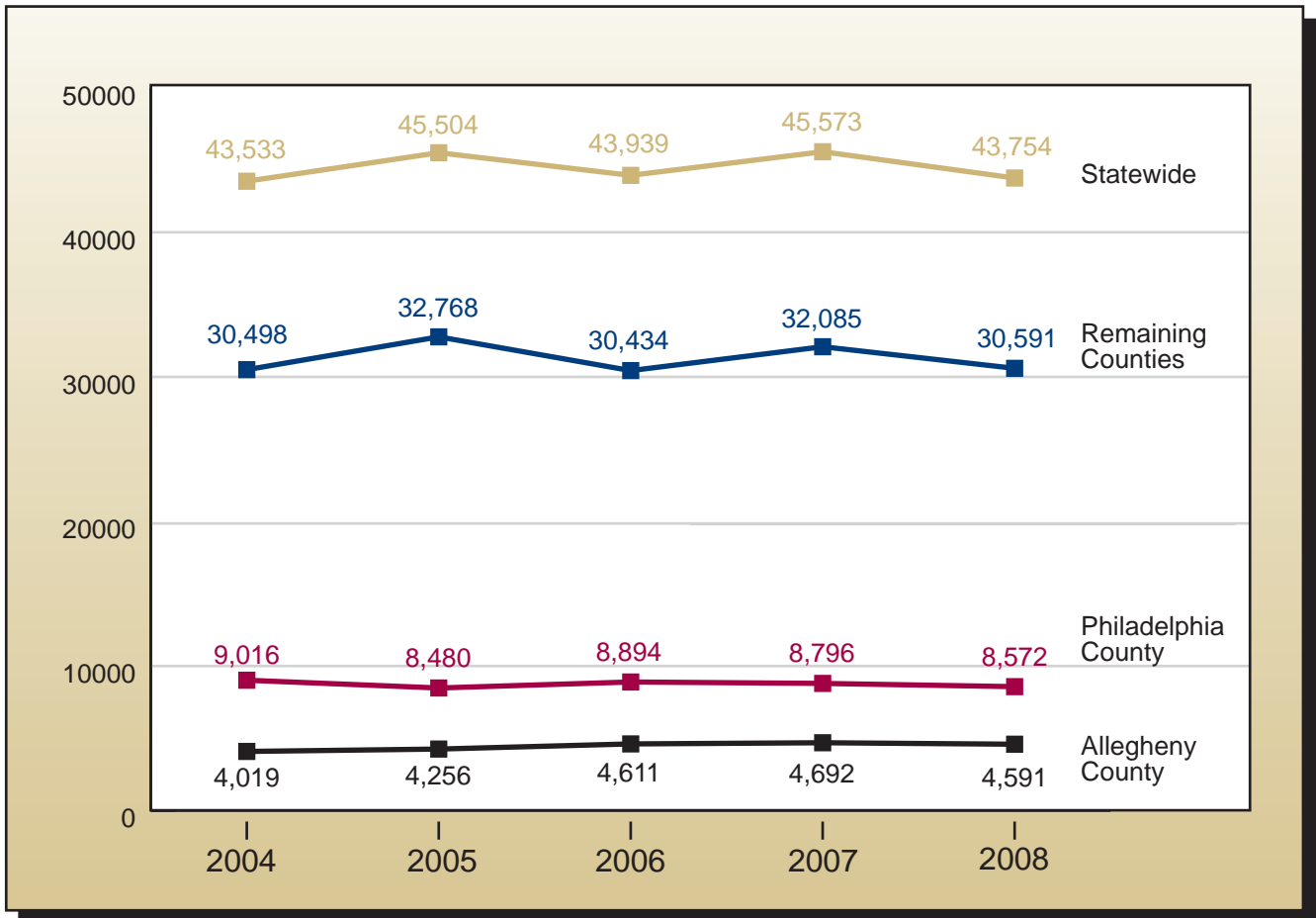
- The 43,754 delinquency dispositions in Pennsylvania in 2008 represent a 4.0% decrease from 2007. Consent Decree became the most frequently utilized disposition, representing 19.1% of all delinquency dispositions, followed in descending order by Probation (18.4%), Informal Adjustment (14.3%), Fines/Costs (8.7%), Complaint Withdrawn (7.6%), and Placement (7.6%). (See pages 4 and 5)
- Delinquency placements to private institutions, including those resulting from disposition reviews, comprised 39.3% of the 7,444 total delinquency placements in 2008, followed in descending order by placements to drug and alcohol programs (13.1%), group homes (11.2%), Boot Camps (10.6%) and Wilderness Based Programs (8.9%). (See page 27)
- 713 substantiated robbery charges represent a 34.5% increase from 2007. Substantiated aggravated assault charges increased by 22.7% and substantiated drug charges increased by 11.9% from 2007. (See page 33)
- Juvenile court dispositions in Pennsylvania continue to primarily involve males. In 2008, males accounted for 76.1% of all juvenile court dispositions, 81.7% of probation dispositions, 88.5% of dispositions involving placement, and 94.8% of transfers to criminal court. (See page 42)
- Of the 33,311 juvenile delinquency dispositions involving males in 2008, 47.1% involved White, Non-Hispanic youth, and 39.2% involved Black, Non-Hispanic youth. Similarly, of the 10,443 dispositions involving females, 47.0% involved White, Non-Hispanic youth and 39.7% involved Black, Non-Hispanic youth. (See pages 44-47)
- In Pennsylvania, the majority of the 43,754 delinquency dispositions involved White youth (55.0%), followed in descending order by Black youth (41.3%). The additional category of Multi-Racial has been added for Delinquency Dispositions by Race. In 2008, 809 delinquency dispositions involved Multi-Racial youth (1.8%). (See pages 48-49)
- 26.5% of the 43,754 delinquency dispositions in 2008 involved seventeen year olds, followed in descending order by sixteen year olds (22.1%) and fifteen year olds (17.0%). (See pages 54-57)
- 55.9% of delinquency dispositions in 2008 reported a family status of the biological parents Never Married or Divorced, while 18.3% reported a family status of the biological parents Married. (See pages 62-63)
- 45.1% of delinquency dispositions in 2008 reported the juvenile living with only the mother, while 18.3% reported the juvenile living with both parents. (See pages 64-65)

# Delinquency Dispositions, 2004-2008

The accompanying graph displays the number of dispositions for delinquency referrals from 2004-2008. Disposition and Placement reviews and dependency referrals are not included in the graph or data tables.

There was a 4.0% decrease in delinquency dispositions from 2007 to 2008. Dispositions involving new allegations in Philadelphia County decreased by 2.5% and Allegheny County dispositions decreased by 2.2%.

# Frequencies of Statewide Delinquency Dispositions, 2008

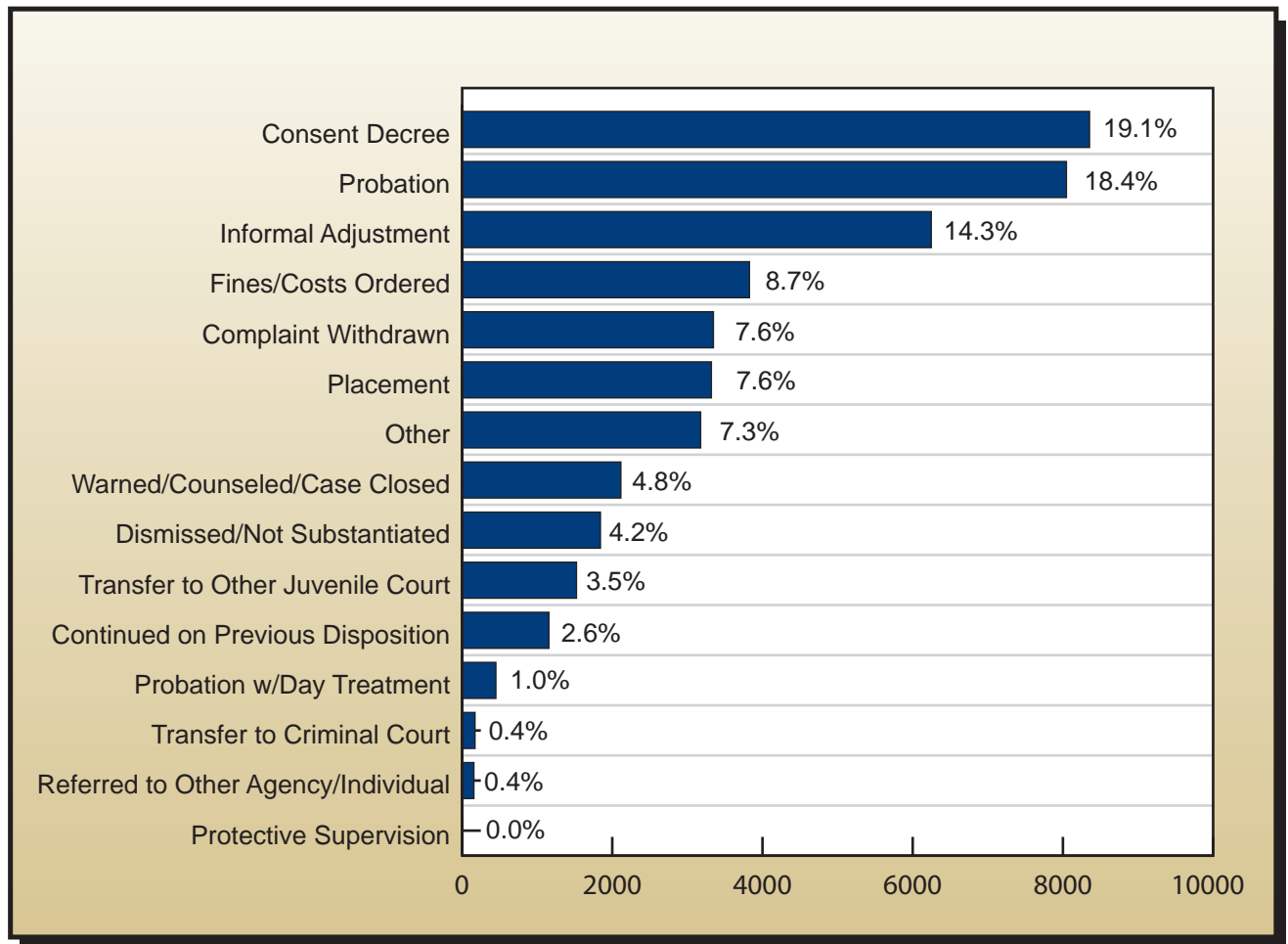
There were 43,754 delinquency-related dispositions in Pennsylvania during 2008.

Consent Decree was the most frequently utilized disposition (8,355, 19.1%) followed in descending order by Probation (8,047, 18.4%), Informal Adjustment (6,248, 14.3%), Fines/Costs Ordered (3,827, 8.7%), Complaint Withdrawn (3,347, 7.6%), Placement (3,320, 7.6%), Other Dispositions (3,177, 7.3%), Warned, Counseled, Case Closed (2,115, 4.8%) All remaining dispositions totaled 12.1%.

Probation with Day Treatment is listed as a separate disposition rather than being included in Probation.

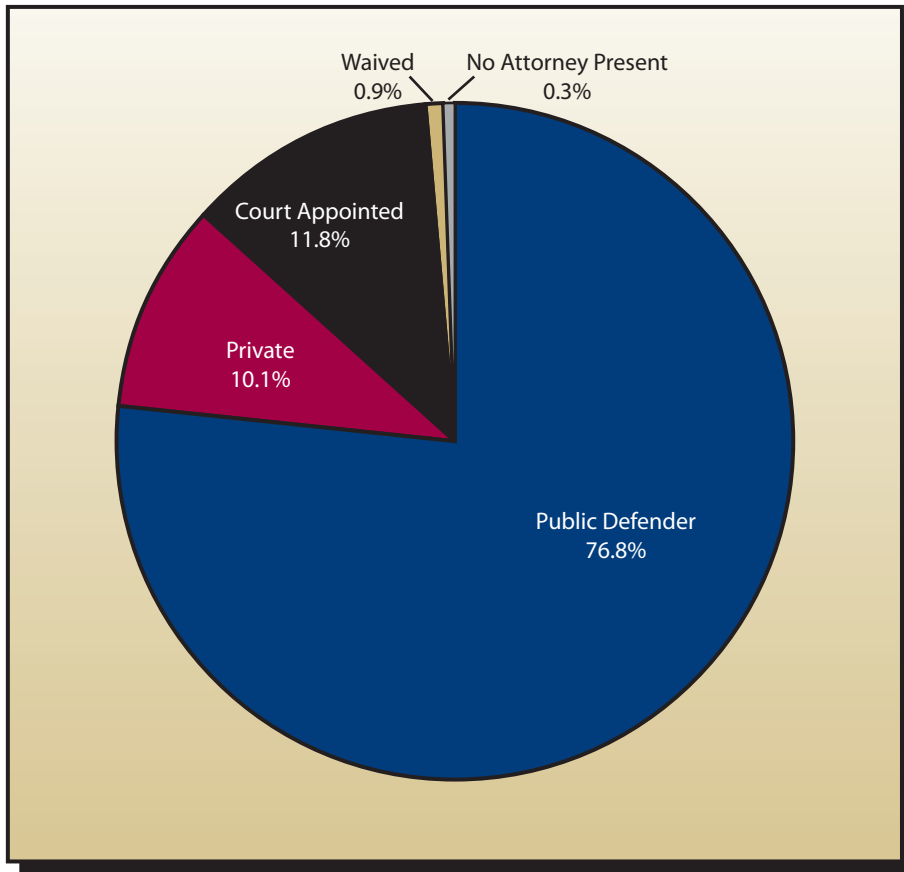
## Type of Attorney Representation for Delinquency Dispositions, 2008

This chart presents a summary of the data included in the table found on page 15. The Court Appointed column of the table includes those cases where counsel, other than the public defender, was appointed by the court. Attorney representation at the court hearing may be waived. These cases are reflected in the table as well as in the chart below.

The data on attorney representation include only the 27,421 dispositions made as a result of a hearing before a master or a judge involving a new delinquency allegation. Informally handled cases, reviews, and dependency cases are not included.

Legal representation in delinquency proceedings, during 2008, was most often provided by public defenders, who were involved in 76.8% of the delinquency dispositions involving hearings. Court appointed attorneys provided legal representation in 11.8% of delinquency dispositions involving hearings, followed by private attorneys at 10.1%. Legal representation was waived in 0.9% of delinquency dispositions involving hearings.

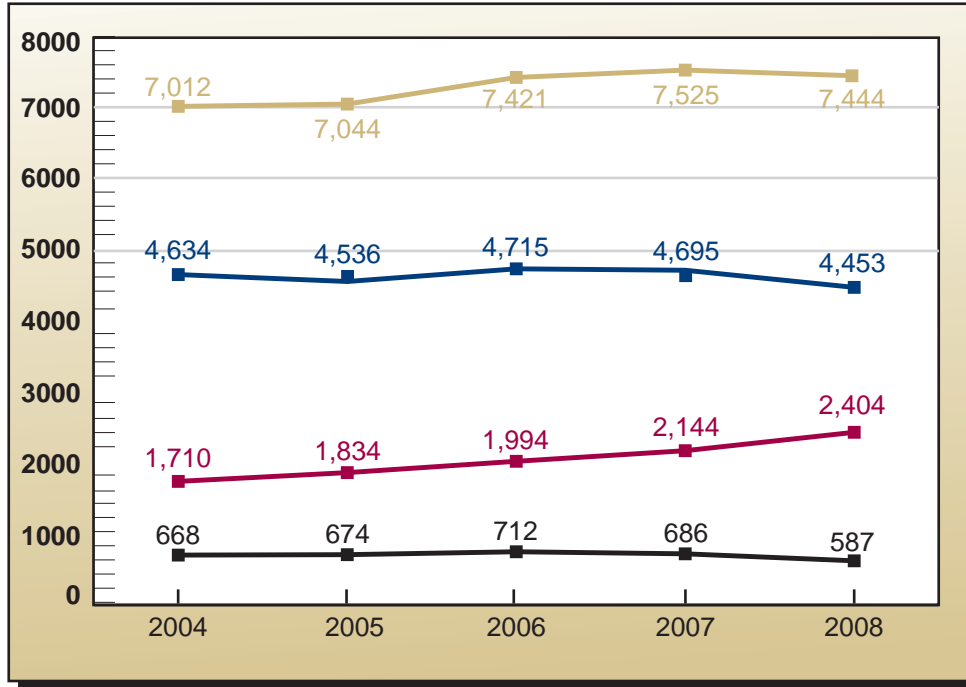

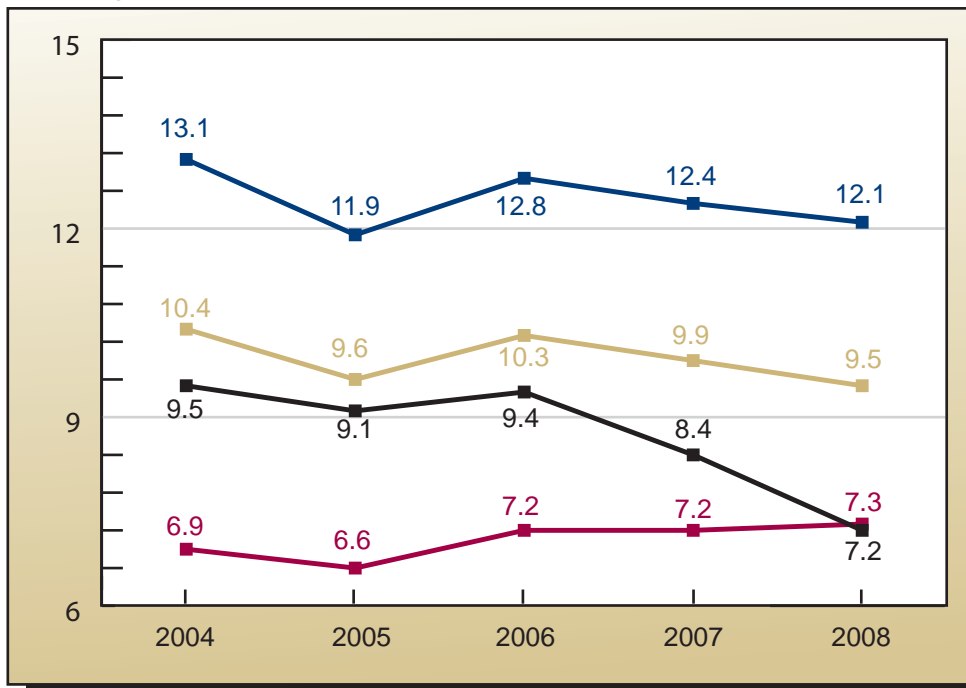

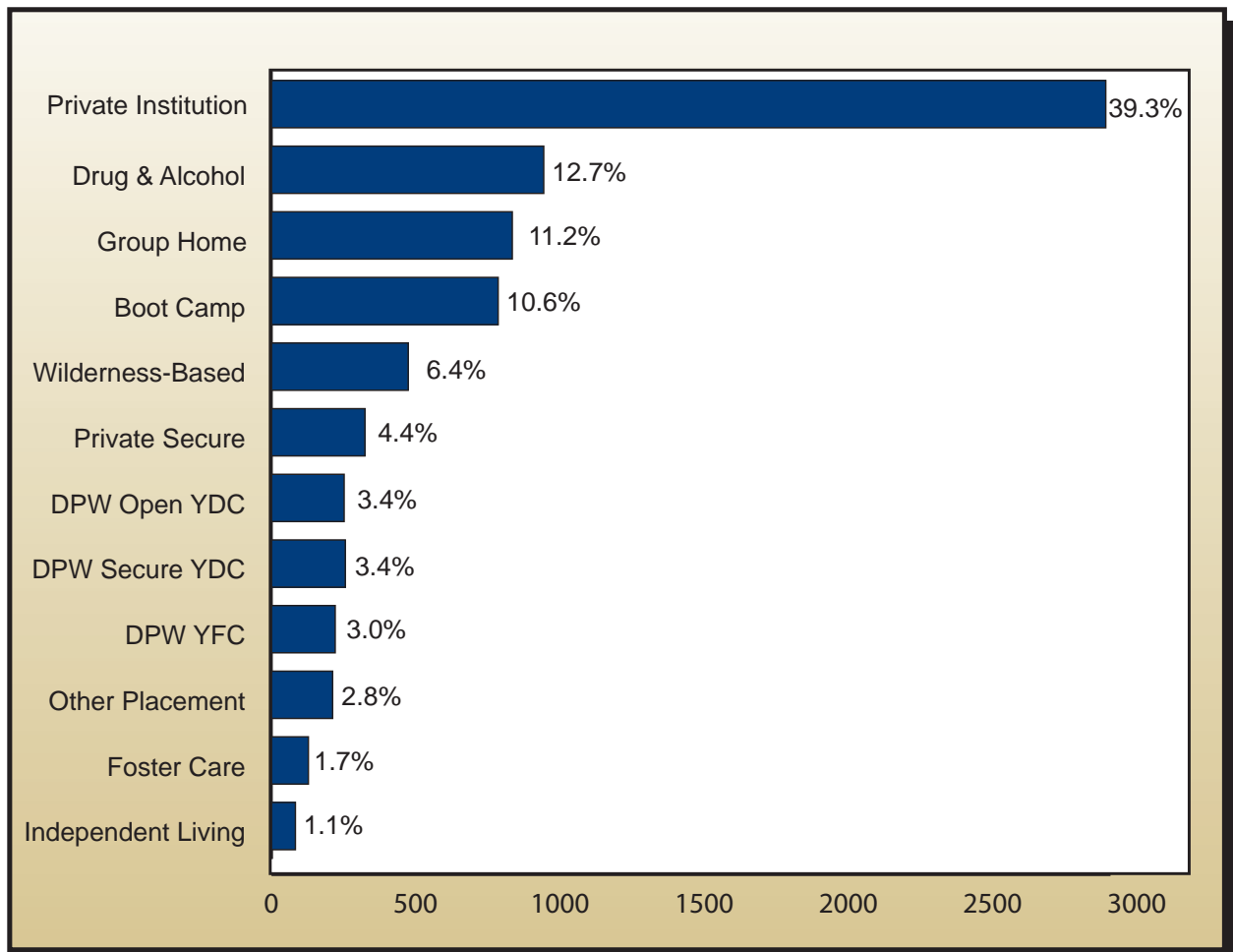

# Alleged Offenses by Type, 2008

Beginning with the 1997 juvenile court dispositions, the seven most serious charges per disposition were collected. This is an increase from four charges per disposition in previous years. For this reason, the reader is cautioned not to compare the 2008 charge information shown on pages 30, 31, 34 and 35 to reports prior to 1997.

Property Offenses represented 31.2% of all alleged offenses in 2008. Offenses against persons comprised 29.1% of all alleged offenses, while drug offenses accounted for 14.3%. Other offenses accounted for 25.4% of all alleged offenses.

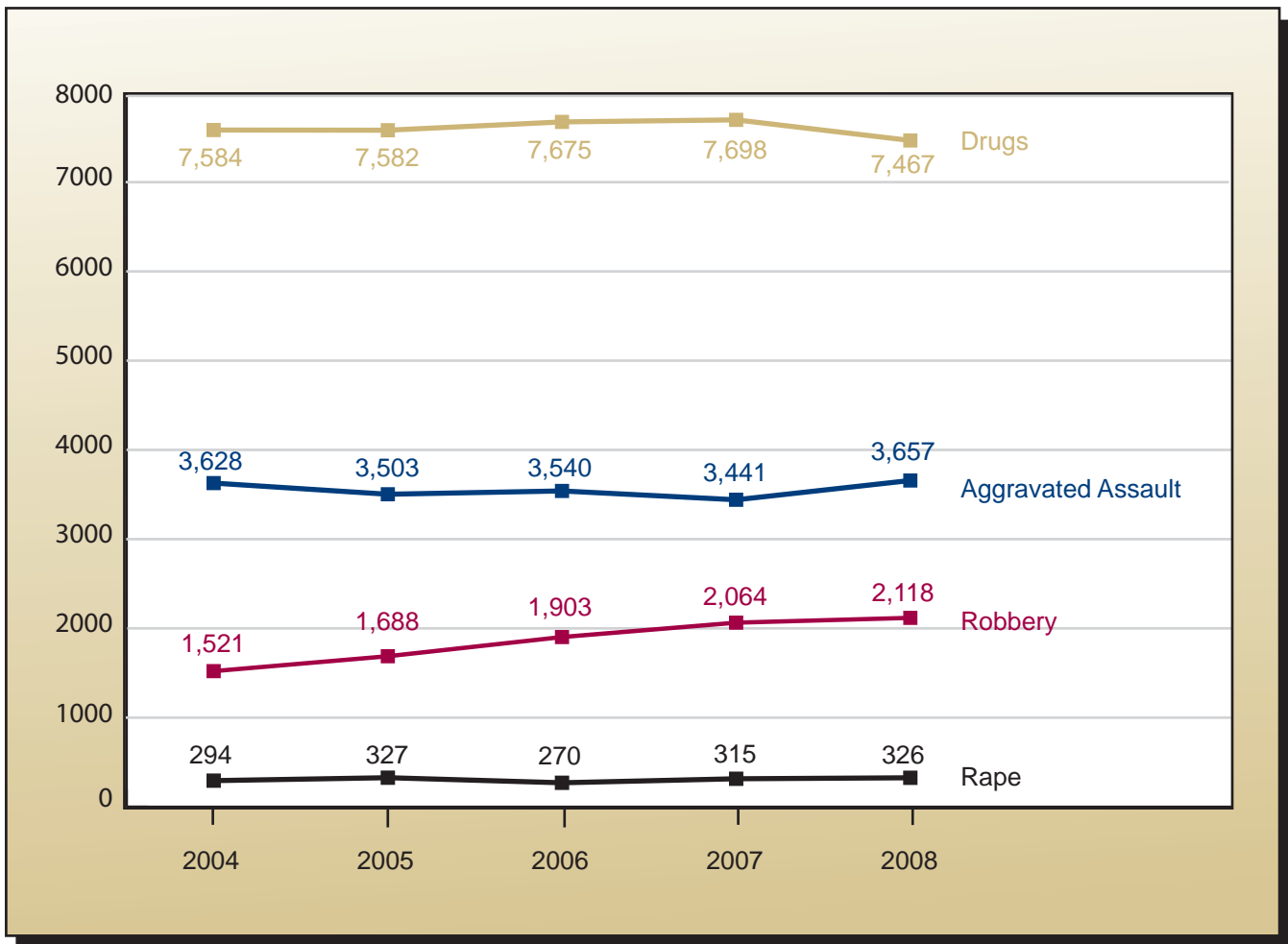

There were 326 alleged rape charges in 2008, representing an 3.5% increase from 2007. Also of interest, were the 2,118 alleged robbery charges in 2008, representing an 2.6% increase from 2007. Aggravated Assault charges increased by 6.3% from 2007.

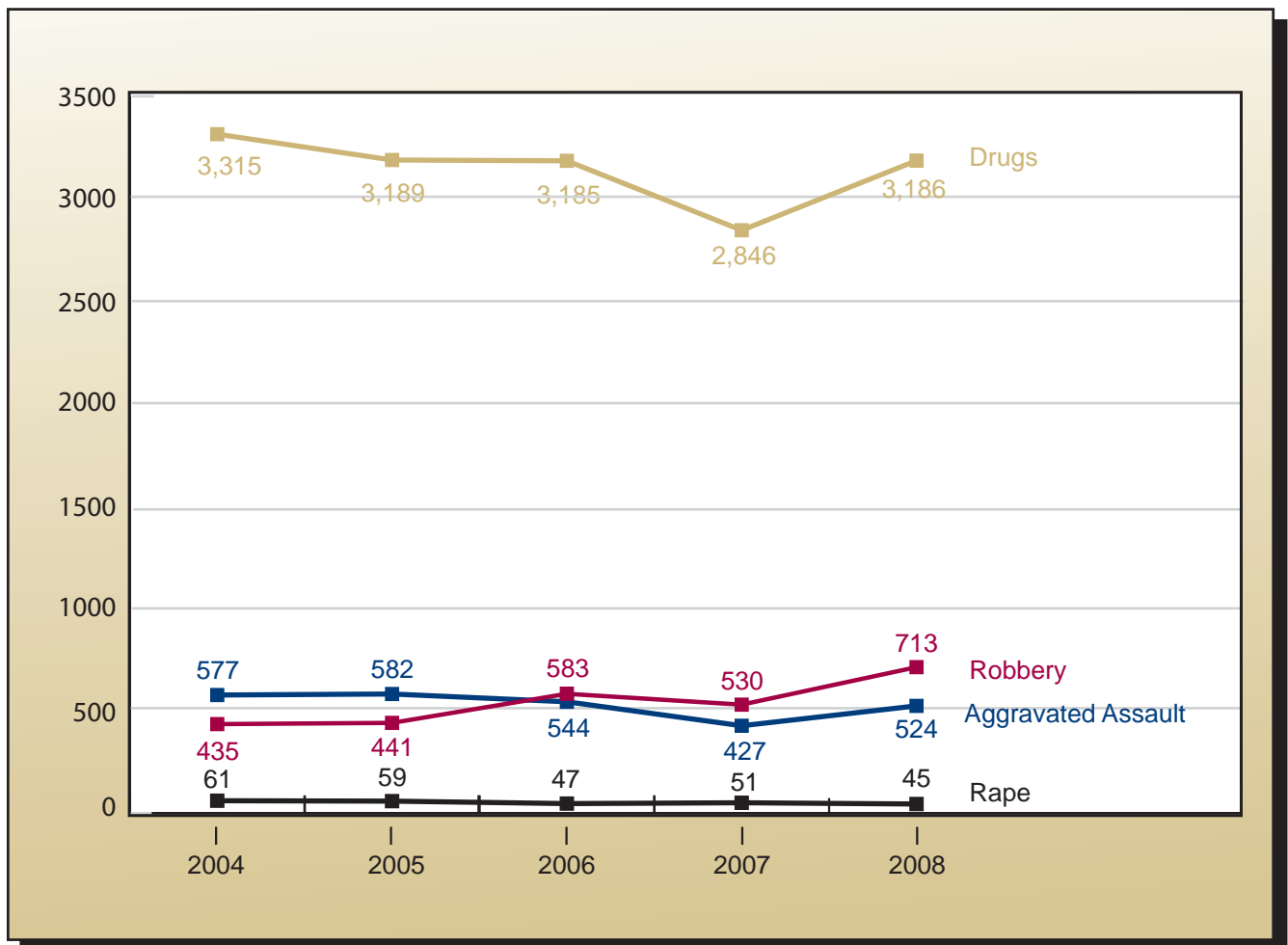


## Selected Substantiated Charges, 2004-2008

A disposition with a substantiated robbery charge and no substantiated rape charge was counted in the robbery category. Any disposition with a substantiated rape charge was counted in the rape category. For the reasons explained on page 30, the reader is again cautioned not to compare these figures to those in reports prior to 1997.

There were 45 substantiated rape charges in 2008, representing a 11.8% decrease from 2007. Of special interest, there were 713 substantiated robbery charges representing a 34.5% increase from 2007. Substantiated aggravated assault charges increased 22.7% from 2007 and drug charges increased 11.9%.

## Secure Detention

The Juvenile Court Judges' Commission's "Standards Governing the Use of Secure Detention Under the Juvenile Act" were developed to guide decision making regarding juvenile detention usage in Pennsylvania's juvenile justice system. Compliance with these standards is required for counties participating in the Commission's Grant-in-Aid Program, with the exception of Philadelphia.

Detention information appearing in this Disposition Report was extracted from the secure detention database at the Center for Juvenile Justice Training and Research. In accordance with the Standards Governing Secure Detention, all counties, except Philadelphia, report their secure detention use to the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission. This is accomplished statewide through the detention centers. Each month, all juvenile detention centers, with the exception of the Youth Study Center in Philadelphia, report their detention admissions along with the Statement of Facts and Reasons that must accompany every probation-authorized admission to secure detention. Philadelphia County is not included in this reporting system.

When interpreting the data contained in these tables, the reader should note the following:

1. The unit of count is the admission of a juvenile to a secure detention center;
2. A juvenile who is admitted to a secure detention center and subsequently transferred to another secure detention center without release is counted as two admissions.

### *Codes Related to Standards Governing the Use of Secure Detention Under The Juvenile Act*

- 100 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of an alleged offense or on the basis of an alleged offense and the child's current status with the court or prior record.
- 200 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of a child's status as an absconder or fugitive; on the basis of a child's record of failing to appear at previous juvenile proceedings; or because of extraordinary circumstances which require secure detention to prevent a child from absconding.
- 300 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the written request of the child or child's attorney.
- 400 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be ordered pending disposition, subsequent to a finding that a child committed a delinquent act or is a delinquent child.
- 500 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be ordered following disposition pending transfer to placement.
- 600 Codes** Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of the child's status, pending or subsequent to a disposition review proceeding.
- Code 701** Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of extraordinary and exceptional circumstances.

## Length of Stay in Secure Detention, 2008\*

This table reflects the median length of stay in secure detention. The median is defined as the value above and below which half the cases fall. In 2008, the median length of stay in secure detention was 11 days which remains the same as 2007.

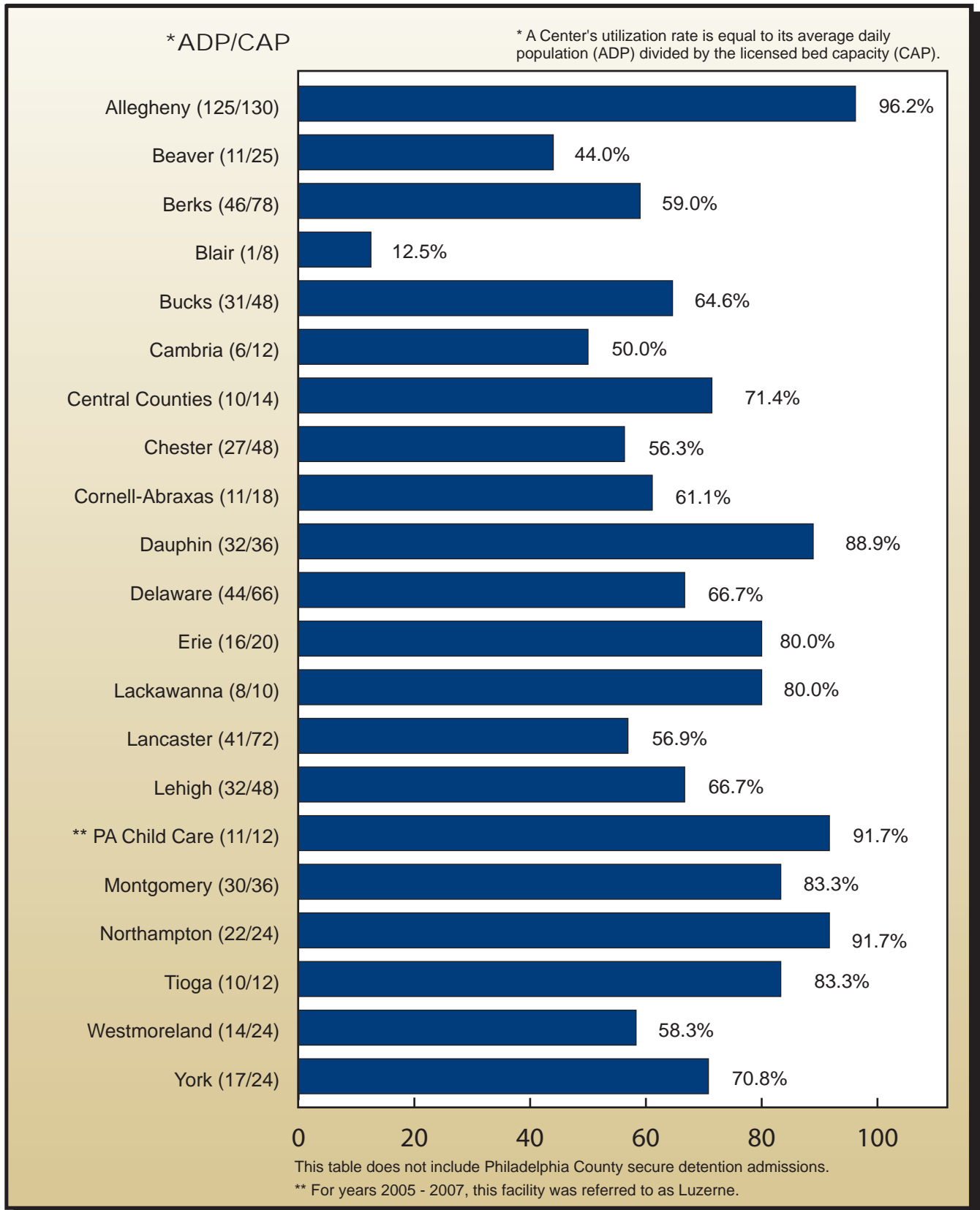

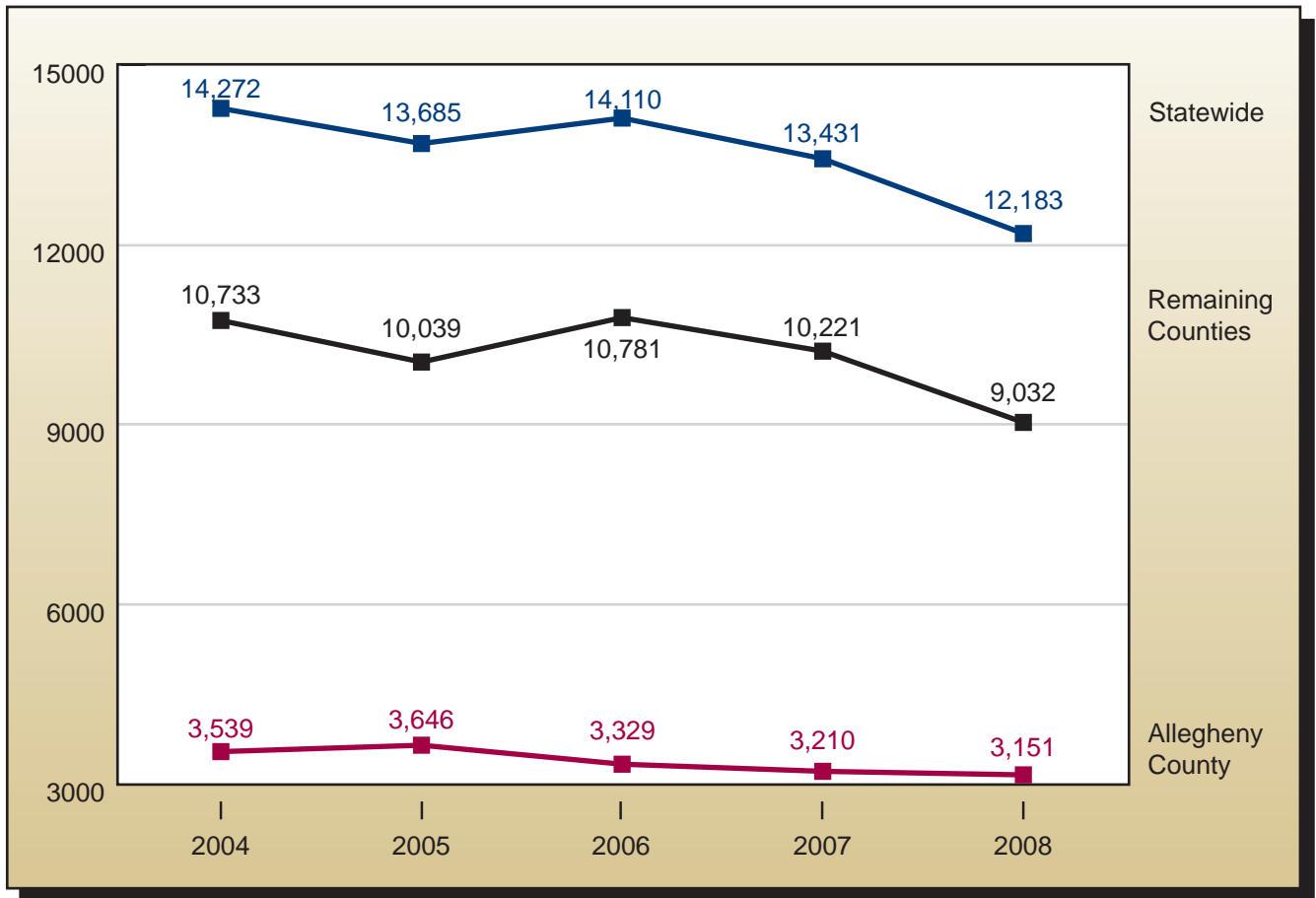
# Utilization Rates for Pennsylvania Juvenile Detention Centers, 2008

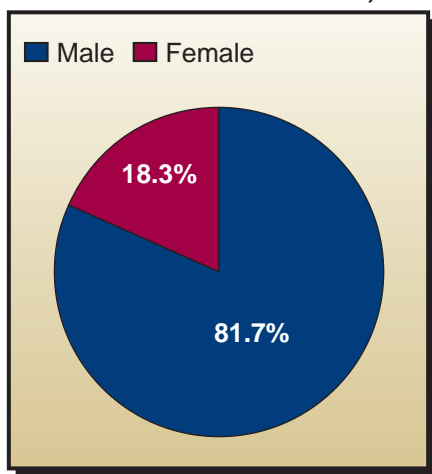

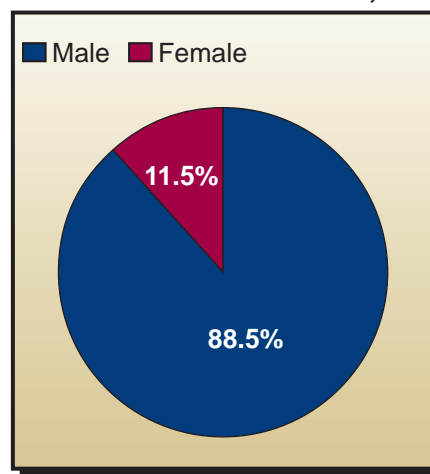
## Selected Dispositions by Gender, 2008

Juvenile court dispositions in Pennsylvania's juvenile justice system primarily involved males. In 2008, males accounted for 76.1% of all juvenile court dispositions, 81.7% of probation dispositions, 88.5% of dispositions involving placement, and 94.8% of transfers to criminal court.

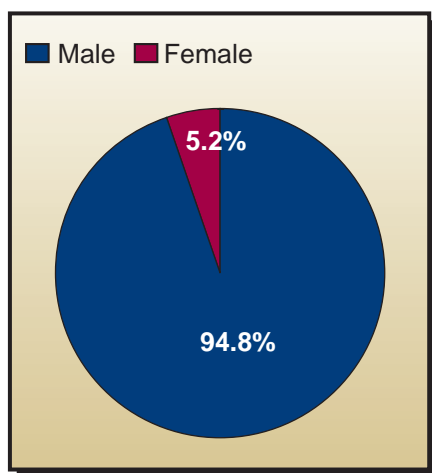
**PROBATION** N = 8,498



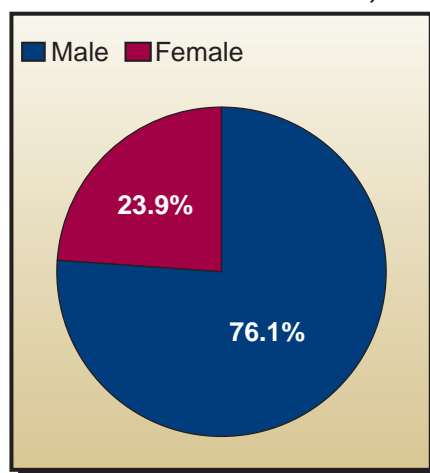
**PLACEMENTS** N = 3,315

**ALL DISPOSITIONS** N = 43,754

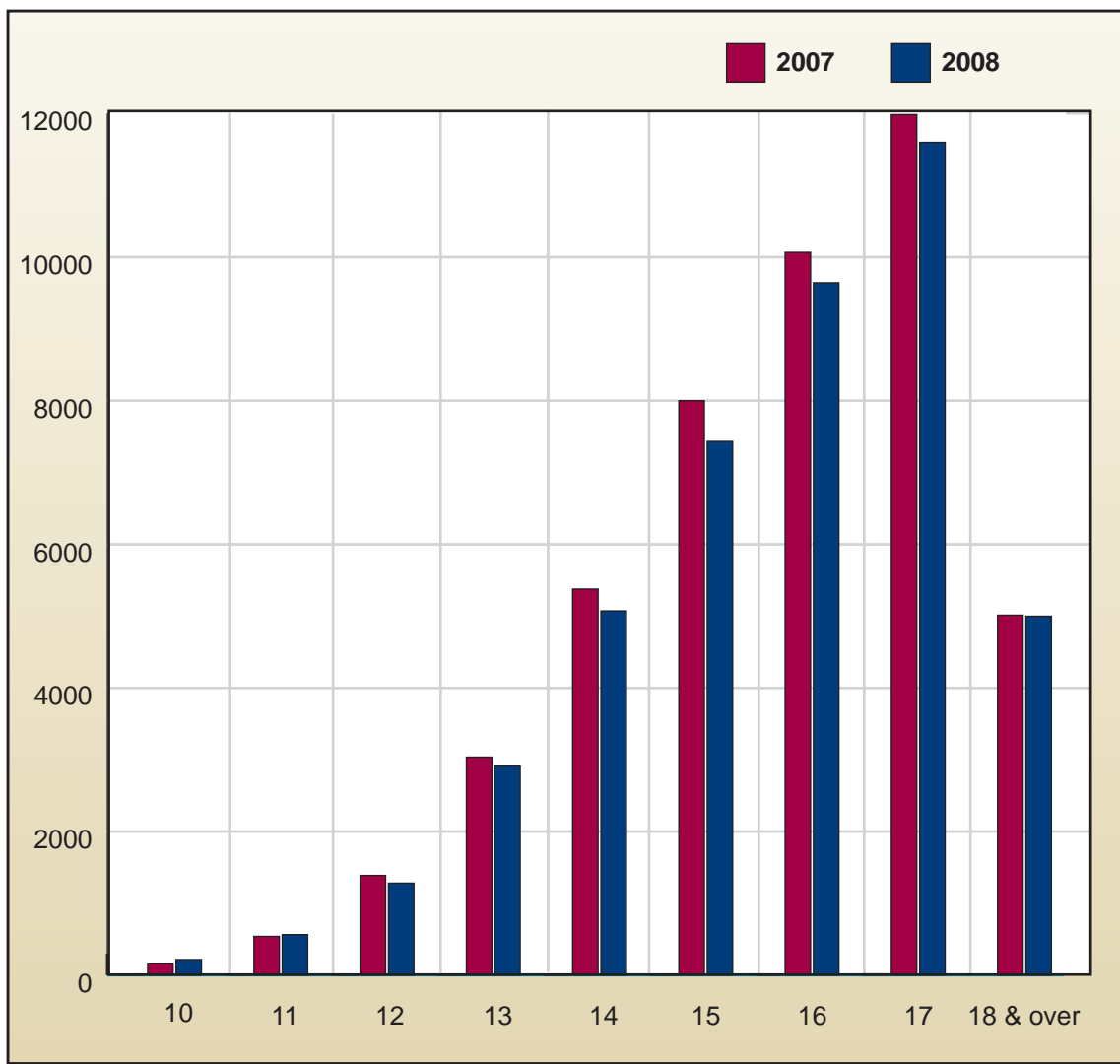


## Total Dispositions by Age, 2007 - 2008

This table reflects the age of the juvenile at the time of disposition.

Seventeen year olds accounted for 11,597 (26.5%) of the 43,754 juvenile delinquency dispositions in 2008, representing the most dispositions for any age group. Juveniles who were age 16 accounted for 9,664 (22.1%), and juveniles who were age 15 accounted for 7,443 (17.0%) of the dispositions in 2008. This data remains consistent with that of 2007, in which seventeen year olds accounted for 26.3%, sixteen year olds accounted for 22.1% and fifteen year olds accounted for 17.6% of juvenile delinquency dispositions.

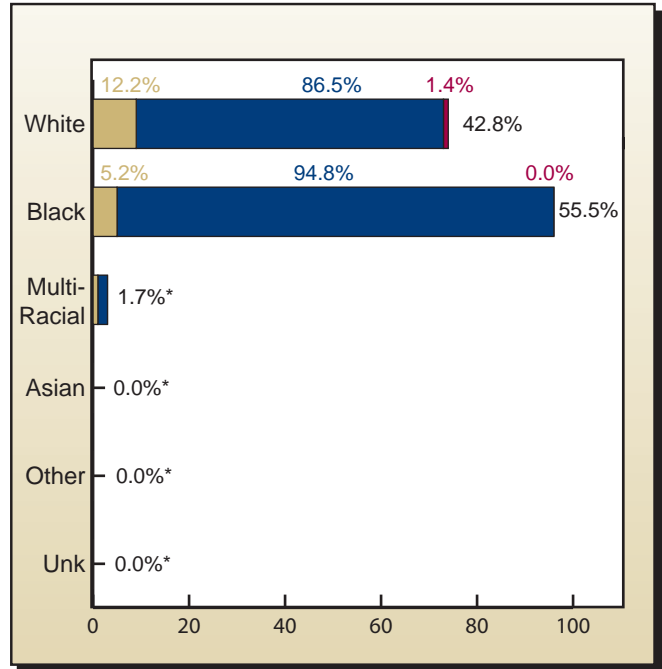
# Selected Dispositions by Race and Ethnicity, 2008
